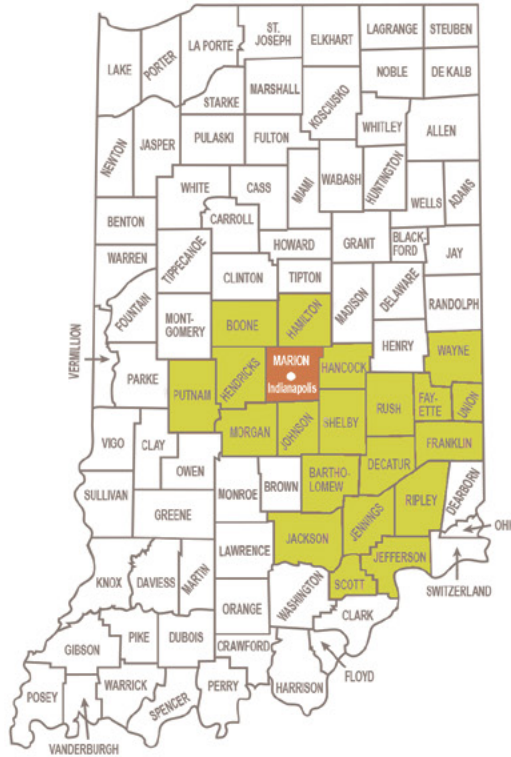

MARION COUNTY



YOUTH PROGRAMS

- BackSacks are distributed to 4,362 children in 102 elementary schools each week.
- Summer BackSacks were distributed to over 4,000 children each week last summer.
- School-Based Pantries in 26 locations serve 21,611 children and their families annually.



CARE PROGRAM

- 63 CARE Mobile Pantries served more than 57,000 people last summer.
- CARE Bags placed in multiple IMPD districts and continuing to expand in Marion and other counties.



SENIOR OUTREACH

- Senior Shopping Days at Gleaners and 4 area pantries serve more than 850 seniors each month.



PRODUCE HOPE

- More than 5 million pounds of fruits and vegetables were distributed in Marion County, through Agency Partners, Mobile Pantries, School-Based Pantries, and Summer BackSacks.



CLIENT OUTREACH

- Nutrition Education initiatives empowered clients through recipes, meal prep instruction and Summer Nutrition Clubs for kids.
- SNAP Outreach assisted nearly 1,500 households in the application process for benefits, resulting in more than 938,000 meals across 21 counties in central and southeast Indiana.
